7.1. There were problems with vandals making fires in the litter bins, next to the hedge and, recently, at the side of the pavilion. The Police had been alerted and Broadland District Council had been asked to empty the paper collection bank.

7.2. The damaged section of the fence at the play area would be renewed on 29th October.
