



### 23.2. Matters arising from the minutes.

Minute 28.1. It was noted that the S106 agreement for the land at Spixworth Road, next to Lavare Park, had been signed by all parties and would be completed in the near future when the sum agreed to pay to prepare the land would be paid to the Council and the work put in hand.

Minute 38.3. Members were pleased to know that the Old Catton Junior Football Club had been named FA Charter Standard Club of the Year 2009 for the Eastern Region.

Minute 40.1. It was noted that the press article had been headlined inaccurately saying that the Cemetery rules were new. However, most of the unauthorised items had been removed without complaint.

Minute 41.1. The Parochial Church Council had agreed to apply for a faculty to remove the new beech hedge that had been planted adjacent to the railings in the new area of the Churchyard.

Minute 42. It was reported that the priorities for the allocation of funds under the Safer Neighbourhoods scheme would be known on 29<sup>th</sup> September and would then be publicised so that Village groups could apply for funding for their projects.
